• **Introductory Note:**

• The paradigm followed: "Penalty of inequality is High for distorted social development".

• Social development: A concept to appraise the dynamics of developing societies & to check up, if there occurs distortion in social development.

• * State authority needs to retrospect whether any distortion is occurring.

* Un-equal social development : leads imposition of high tax and high penalty on the relatively richer upper middle class and lower middle class in Indian society.

* What are we doing for the poor to be self-reliant and to change their outlook in such context? To avoid distortion and unequal penalty?
